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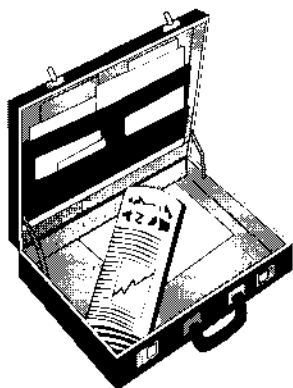

Can't play Monday? Take two half-point BYES on Monday! However, Monday BYES must be requested no later than Saturday. Up to two on-half point BYES allowed per adult team.

Adult Section: 6-SS, 50/2, 3-day format. **PRIZES IN ADULT SECTION:** Plaque plus four Master Quartz clocks to top team, plaque plus four BHB clocks to 2nd and 3rd Place teams. Master Quartz clock awarded to top player at each board. Trophies to top teams with average rating below 2000, 1800, and 1600, top company team, top college team, best Team Name, and top teams from Illinois, Wisconsin, Indiana, Iowa, Michigan, Ohio, Minnesota and Missouri. Rounds 2-7, 10-5, 9-3:30.

Junior (under 19) Section; Sat. 50/2, Sun. Game-70, 2-day format, 5-SS. Junior Section will compete with adults on Saturday, but only versus other school teams on Sunday. The Junior Section will end one day earlier than the Adult Section. **PRIZES IN JUNIOR SECTION:** Trophies to top three high school teams and top three grammar school teams. Trophy to highest scoring player at each of the four Boards. Rounds 2-7, 10-1-4.

1994 ILLINOIS TOUR RULES

The Illinois Chess Association Tour is an annual, year-long series of USCF-rated tournaments offering Tour points to participants and year-end cash prizes to the top performers in each of several rating classes.

There are two types of Tour events, maxi- and mini-. Major tournaments such as the Tim Just Winter Open, Greater Peoria Open, Mid-America Class, Chicago Open, Master Challenge, and Illinois Open are likely to be maxi-events, while others (often one-day tournaments) will be mini-events.

Tour points are awarded in seven rating classes: Master (2200 and up), Expert (2000-2199), Class A (1800-1999), Class B (1600-1799), Class C (1400-1599), Class D (1200-1399) and Class E (below 1200).

Players earn Tour points according to score. Maxi-events award twice as many points as mini-events. For a perfect score in a maxi, the award varies from 28 in a four-round tournament to 40 in a seven-rounder. For each half-point below a perfect score, the award is cut by a factor which varies from .50 to .70 depending on the number of rounds. When this cutting would result in the Tour award being too low, points are awarded in direct proportion to the score. No Tour points are awarded for a score of zero.

Following are the tables for awarding Tour points in maxi- and mini-events of three, four, five, six, and seven rounds.

Each Tour tournament, or section thereof, awards Tour points in any given rating class ONLY if: (1) the tournament or section is open to ALL players in that class, and (2) at least one player in that class, or in a higher class, actually plays in the tournament or section. Each player in a Tour event can earn points only in his own rating class and those above.

EXAMPLES:

1. Kathy Knight, an A player, scores 4-1 in a five-round maxi-event. According to the chart, she has earned twelve Tour points. The tournament is a single-section event, open to all, and at least one Master actually participates. Kathy's twelve Tour points are awarded in all classes A through Master. She earns twelve A points, twelve Expert points, and twelve Master points.

2. Benjamin Bishop, a B player, scores 4.5-0.5 in a five-round maxi-event. The chart shows that he has earned 19 Tour points. But he has chosen to play in the under-2000 section, so his Tour points are awarded only in classes A and B. He receives 19 A points and 19 B points.

All Illinois residents playing in Illinois Tour events must be Illinois Chess Association members. Out-of-staters who are members of their home state chess associations need not join ICA, but their Tour points will not count at year-end unless they were ICA members when they played in each of their Tour events.

At the end of the year, cash prizes are awarded to those ICA members who have accumulated the greatest Tour point totals in each class. The 1994 Illinois Tour prizes are as follows:

Cash prizes will be awarded only to those players who play in at least three Tour events during 1994. Prizes which would have been won by players with only one or two events will be distributed to those next in line.

Unrated players can accumulate Tour points only in the Master class, and then only if they play in a tournament or section open to all Masters and in which at least one Master actually participates. Unrateds in all Tour events, however, will have their events counted towards the three-event minimum; this will help them later in the year when they become rated.

ORGANIZERS: Putting your tournaments on the ICA Tour will enhance their prestige and increase attendance. Players have come to expect that major events, especially, will be ICA Tour events.

It is easy to sponsor a Tour event, but there are several rules which must be followed. A Tour event must be a weekend Swiss of at least three rounds, and it must be listed in the Tournament Life section of Chess Life. The Chess Life announcement must include the phrase "ICA membership required" along with the dollar amount of ICA dues. The statement "an ICA Tour mini-event" or "an ICA Tour maxi-event" should also be included. Making "Mini-Tour" or "Maxi-Tour" part of the name of the tournament is a good idea also.

A Tour event must also be listed in the Calendar published bi-monthly in the Illinois Chess Bulletin. Be sure to observe the ICB's published deadlines, and keep in close contact with editor and calendar manager Bob Renaut so you won't be left out.

For maxi-events, there are some additional rules. A Tour maxi-event must be a two-day (or more) event of at least four rounds, and there must be a guaranteed prize fund of at least \$500.00. A based-on prize fund of at least \$1000.00 is fine, too, since USCF requires that at least half of such projected prize funds actually be paid.

A Tour event should be set up in such a way that Tour points can be awarded fairly. Section cut-offs, if any, should be at 2200, 2000, 1800, 1600, 1400, and/or 1200. The following are examples of recommended Tour formats:

- (1) 1 section, open to all.
- (2) 2 sections, open and under-1800.
- (3) 3 sections, 1600-&-over, under-2000, and under-1400.

An example of an inadvisable tour format would be an under-1900 section. Such a section could not award Tour points to A players because it would not be open to ALL class A players.

Another inadvisable format would be the quad or the octagon -- four- or eight-player sections grouped by rating. Such an event almost certainly would, for example, split the B players across two sections, neither of which could award B points because neither would be open to ALL players in class B.

The fee for running a Tour event is \$1.00 per player. For maxi-events, there is a \$50.00 minimum and a \$100.00 maximum. For mini-events, there is no minimum, and the maximum is \$50.00. In addition, your organization must affiliate with ICA at \$25.00 per year. Past experience suggests that these fees repay the organizer many times over in added entry fees, as having an event on the Tour increases its appeal to most players.

A maxi-event is entitled to a free full-page ICB ad. A mini-event gets a free half-page ad. But to take advantage, you must submit your ad camera-ready to the ICB editor by the published deadline. Do not expect the editor to concoct an ad for you.

The ICA officers reserve the right to reject the Tour status of any tournament. To avoid conflicts, the officers will be scrutinizing the schedule carefully. As stated previously, your event must be cleared through calendar monitor Bob Renaut before it is sent to Chess Life ☐

Senior Master Billy Colias 1966-1993

The Midwest chess world will tell many Billy Colias stories in coming months and within the year we will remember him at a memorial tournament. A book of his games will soon be in preparation. Chess magazines on the national level like Chess Life will take note of his death and our own Illinois Chess Bulletin will especially feature his chess career. While Billy was Indiana-born, Illinois and the Chicago area in particular were the primary scenes of his chess activity.

From the time he was a kid of twelve Billy never doubted he wanted to be a chess professional. In the Chicago-area he was one of only three or four masters who made a go of it. He understood the need for developing the allied skills every chess professional needs: teaching skills, writing skills, research techniques, computer savvy, the willingness to travel. Most of all he found a unique way of communicating his passionate love for chess to others. In his teaching job in Greenville, NC and more recently at work in New York for the American Chess Foundation running the Manhattan Chess Club, Billy's ebullience for the game was manifest. He was a natural teacher, combining the two basic elements of all great teachers: mastery of his subject and an empathy for his student.

Bill conquered cancer as a youngster, undergoing intensive and lengthy chemotherapy. I remember him at one of the early Master Challenges, his first appearance on the tournament circuit after treatment. The forever smile was there. He couldn't wait to make his first move.

As the years went by Billy's game improved markedly. He made master in 1982. His tournament results in the next decade would push him over the 2400 mark. Just last year Billy won the ICA Tour's Master prize.

Billy was one of several local masters who taught in my Junior Chess Program. Many times teachers and coaches in schools he visited called to thank me for sending Billy to their schools. The kids loved him. When Billy applied for the ACF job last year he asked me for a letter of recommendation. I wrote it with enthusiasm. Billy considered his move to New York a turning point in his chess career: he would be near strong tournaments, the opportunity for teaching assignments were many, his work at the Manhattan Chess Club would keep him close to the action. He had begun collaboration with NM Eric Schiller on writing projects. (He had earlier worked with Eric in the pressroom at the World Championship in 1990.) His first book on the Staunton Gambit was recently

published and he was well along on another book. He had begun to establish himself beyond the local chess scene.

Bill died at the age of twenty-seven having accomplished more in chess than most of us do in a statistical lifetime. The loss of talent cut down before its time is part of our sorrow. I wish I could tell you about the many hours Billy and I spent together talking about chess, about his life, about his hopes. Most of all, he talked about his love for the game, how he could become a stronger player, how he could become a better teacher. I know what personal demons Billy took with him when he left the Midwest. But I also know he expected to live forever, creating beautiful moves and combinations, earning a living and living his life totally with the game he loved.

If tears could bring him back he would be here playing Dr. Martinovsky in a crucial game or analyzing by the hour with his fellow masters. But my best memory is of Billy talking about chess to a bunch of ten and twelve year old kids, smiling at the demo board, waiting for a raised hand to see a "!" move, searching his class for the gleam of recognition of a small truth at e5. "Yes! You got it! Now what's next? Look at this line..." And off Billy went, occasionally touching base by locating a nodding head in the class. We grieve with his family. We will remember Billy with love □

BILLY COLIAS -

He loved the game and he was loved.

I was asked to write a short history of Billy Colias' involvement with chess for the ICB. This is a difficult assignment for me, as I loved Billy as if he were one of my own kids, and his death has been a tragic loss. I guess I know enough "Billy" stories to write a book. Maybe that will take place too. I hope so.

Billy Colias, "Billy", I guess whenever anyone I know involved with chess said "Billy" it was always Billy Colias. So here goes. Billy's life with chess and chess' life with Billy.

Billy was born June 3rd, 1966, and died November 4th, 1993.

I got to know Billy when he was 12. He came to my first "Put the Fun in Chess" tournament in 1978. His parents would wait hours for him to finish his last game and drive him home. I got to know them too. Wonderful parents. A wonderful son.

He had been playing chess since first grade and was a very strong player at age 12. His good friend Peter Beriolos, who was self taught in chess, actually got him involved first. Then Ed Vano from Hammond, Indiana and later Mr. Graves from Munster High School helped with his instructions. Billy and Peter were on the Wilbert Wright Grade School team in Munster, Indiana when they won the state championship in his eight grade. Billy and Peter teamed up again and won the state championships again in high school at Munster High. Billy lived in Munster, Indiana but we (Illinois) claimed him also!

When Billy was in sixth grade, he was also interested in wrestling. He was strong, well built and an excellent wrestling student. He made the Munster High School team, and would have probably excelled in wrestling too. But he gave up wrestling when he was in junior high for chess. Chess was his real love. His mistress. When Billy was 15 he said he was going to devote his whole life to chess - HE DID. But he had a few roadblocks.

In early 1982, Billy was diagnosed as having lymph node cancer. In November, 1982, Billy had a cancerous tumor removed and in the next three years would have three more operations relating to his cancer. During the period from 1982 to 1985 Billy also had three extensive chemotherapy treatments. Billy's operations and treatments sapped his strength.

When he was finally "cured" he said that he was going to enjoy life to the fullest because he wouldn't live past 27. A self fulfilling prophesy! Everyone that he came in contact with was attracted to him - he had that kind of magnetism. Many, like me, even loved him. After his bout with cancer he dove into chess, even more than before, but he never let anyone get close to him again.

In 1983, Billy and I drove to Janesville, Wisconsin for the JCA Anniversary Open. How ironic that that was the only tournament I ever won. I won some cash and a trophy that belonged to Bill Martz. Bill had died of cancer a few years earlier. We had a great weekend. Billy would stay up past midnight going over his games - and even going over mine. Billy won the speed championship at that tournament. He beat Steve Tennant and Grandmaster Arthur Bisquier - TWICE! Driving the two and a half hours each way with Billy was as exciting as the tournament. He was like a chess dynamo even in the car. Studying, going over games and playing me blindfolded as I would make the moves on a magnetic board while driving. No, I never beat him. I didn't even draw. He loved it! Anything, as long as it was CHESS.

About this time Billy won a \$2,500 scholarship from the Chicago Sun Times for second place against a computer. We hoped that he would take advantage of this opportunity, but he never did. He loved chess too much, and just didn't want to be bothered learning anything else.

'84-'85-'86....Billy's rating was climbing - 2400 plus now. He got an invitation to play in the US Junior championship. Time for some real heavy lessons! Grandmaster Roman Dzindichashvili spent two weeks with Billy in his home in Munster, Indiana and then the four of us went to New York for the US Junior Closed at the Manhattan Chess Club. He had drawing and winning games against many of the players, but he would always "see things" that weren't there and lose. Maxim Dlugy offered Billy a draw three times, Billy refused each time. With "Dzinji" analyzing the adjournment for 45 minutes they agreed on a particular move and a line that looked good enough for Billy to win. When Billy resumed play he made an entirely different move and lost the game. He said he thought he saw something at the last minute. He was that headstrong. Or maybe he never really had that "killer instinct". I don't know.

In 1987, Billy took a chess job for a year in North Carolina - teaching chess to grammar school kids. I didn't hear from him much from there, but I kept track of him. He was in his environment. He loved it. But he wasn't paid what had

been agreed upon so back to Chicagoland he came.

He was giving chess lessons again and playing in all the local tournaments and others, including the National Open, World Open and any that he could afford to go to. He was still living at home, using his father's car. Just getting by - but he was happy.

Billy worked intensely with Eric Schiller in Chicago. Billy would study from Eric's vast chess library and Billy and Eric would analyze games. Billy made extra money annotating games for some of Eric's books. Eric and Billy went to New York together in 1990 to cover the world championships and in early 1993 they published a fine book together: *How to Play Black Against the Staunton Gambit*.

Billy was still giving chess lessons. He was even teaching the moves to his two year old niece at the family Christmas party last year. He was one of Helen Warren's key chess instructors in her program to promote chess to youngsters. He would drive anywhere to give chess lessons. It didn't matter to him how far, as long as it was for CHESS. He loved the game and he loved kids. He loved life and he was living it to the fullest.

This summer Billy had a job offer. A dream come true. Billy went to New York to work at the Manhattan Chess Club. Billy ran the Club. He sold memberships, showed the Club to prospective new members, gave chess lessons, ran tournaments and even sold chess books in the Chess Federation's store on the premises. He was making a handsome living - doing what he loved most. CHESS - CHESS - CHESS. Fan Adams told me that he had to force Billy to take two days off a week. If he didn't Billy would have been there seven days a week. He was really a chess dynamo!

Then Billy died.

Billy had taken four Tylenol after he had a few drinks and the combination of the Tylenol, alcohol and the damage the chemotherapy had done to his liver and kidneys when he was a teenager was too much. His liver and kidneys just quit.

His parents - who had supported him throughout his life - and I cleaned out Billy's room the week after the funeral. They gave me hundreds of his games. He saved them all. His high school wins at the Indiana championships, his games against Albert Chow and his win against Andy Soltis. You'll be seeing them, I'm sure. Billy also had signs all over the walls in his room that read "2500". He was going to get to 2500 this year. Billy had made me a \$500 bet against six chess lessons that he would.

God, I wish I would have lost that bet ☐



Billy had other talents as well. Billy wrote poems on an occasion. Here is one he wrote on the back of a napkin on a train ride back from North Carolina after he just broke up with a young woman.

Offers a pawn with the idea of profiting from the open c-file later. For 14.00, which current theory prefers as the clearer attacking path, see the next game.

14...Rc4

Black could decline with 14...Ra7 15.Qh5 (15.Nb5 Qa5+ 16.b4 Nb4 17.00 unclear) Rb7 16.Qf5+ Ke8 17.Nf6+ with a probable draw.

15.Qh5?!

Necessary is 15.00 Re4?! (15...Nd4!) 16.Rc1! when Black's King can't run away to the q-side. Also note 15.Nb6+ Kc7 16.Nc4 Bh6!

15...Ne7

Sveshnikov, in the Russian edition (1987) of his book on this defense, cites the refutation of 15.Qh5 as 15...Re4+ 16.Kf1 Qh4 17.Qf7+ Be7 18.Ne6 Ba6+ 19.Kg1 Nd4 20.Nd4 Rd4 21.g3 Rf8 22.Nb6+ (22,gh? Rg4 mate) Kc6 23.Qb3 Rb4 24.Qc3+ Kb6 25.f4 Rf4 26.Qe3+ Rd4 0-1, Chiburdanidze-Maximovic, 1983. Try wading through this with the clock ticking! Sveshnikov also notes that this refutation was published 5 years earlier (1978) by the English IM Povah.

16.Qf7 Rc7 17.Nf6+

If 17.00 Rc5 18.Nf6+ Kc7 19.b4 Rc6 20.Rfc1 Kb8 21.b5 Rc1+ 22.Rc1 Bh6 0-1 in Subitov-Mayorov,1979.

17...Kc6 18.Qb3! Bh6 19.00 d5 20.Qb4!!

Kotov's move which improved on 20.ed+ Kd6 21.Qb6+ Rc6! 22.Qd8+ Rd8 23.dc Nc6 with an unclear position. After the move in the game Black will be hard pressed to stop mate.

20...Ba6 21.Rac1+

The result of 14.c4.

21...Bc1 22.Rc1+ Bc4 23.ed+ Qd5 24.Nd5 Kd5
25.Rd1+ Ke4 26.f3+ 1-0.

Nice game,huh? This was all analysis by Kotov-right down to 26.f3+.

Before I checked the books on this line, I tried defending the Black side of this position several times. Believe me, in the calm setting of my home, without a clock running, my wobbly King hit the deck long before Kaushansky's did in the game. The depth of Bill's theoretical knowledge in this variation is impressive. I also admire Kaushansky's ability to find the best defensive moves in Kotov's analysis over the board; it was just his bad luck to fall into published analysis. When I play over a game like this I realize why my title is National Master and these two are Senior Masters.

I think it's safe to assume that Bill had no intention of repeating the previous line and testing his opponent's preparation. 14.00 is considered best today, but the pitfalls in the tactical minefield of the last game are equally present here, too; they're just hidden on different squares.

14...Ra7

While this is a good reply to 14.c4 (see note to move 14.

in their previous game), here it is too slow. Black wants to rid himself of the N on c7 to reduce the strength of White's attack. A safer way to achieve this is by playing 14...Qg5 first. This stops any Qh5 by White and allows Black counterplay with ...Rg8. For example, 14...Qg5 15.c4 Rg8 16.g3 Ra7 17.Nb5 Rb7 18.a4 f4! and Black will give as good as he gets in this position. Sveshnikov analyzes 14...Re4 15.Qh5 Ne7! and believes that White has "tricky problems" to solve. Move order is very important in this position. A seemingly logical defensive set-up not mentioned by Sveshnikov is 14...Ne7?! Though 15.c4! leads to: a) 15...Rc4? 16.Qb3 Rc5 (16...Rc7 and the landmine detonates on 17.Nf6+ Kc6 18.Rc1 mate) 17.Qa4+ Nc6 18.b4; or b) 15...Ra7 16.Nb5 Ra5 17.ef Nd5 18.Qd5 Ke7 19.c5! Rb5 20.cd Qd6 21.Qb5 and wins.

15.Nb5 Rb7 16.c4 fe 17.f4!

The fate of the Black King is sealed without the Black Queen on g5 to slow White down.

17...Be7 18.Qh5 Ke8 19.Rad1 ef 20.Ne7 Ke7 21.Nd6 Qf8 22.Qc5 Ke6 23.Qc6 1-0.

Looks safe yet Black should consider 13...Kf6! which is similar to the previous note. If 14.Qh8 Kf7 (note how the Nd7 covers the Bf8) 15.Nb3 Nb3 16.ab e5!

14.Qh8 Kf7 15.Nb3 Nb3

Opening the a-file accelerates White's attack.

16.ab e5?

16...Bd7 had to be tried.

17.Bg6+ Kg6 18.Qf8 d4 19.b4 Qc6 20.Ra3 Nh5 21.Qe7 1-0.

After playing through several of Bill's games, I was fascinated with his ability to infuse tension, which often led to tactics, in rather calm positional settings. The following game is a good example.

Stopping White from castling, but appearances are deceptive. Black must secure c6 for the N's return from b4.

Tactics prevail after 12...Nc6 13.Nd5! The exchange of Bishops saves a pawn but loses the King in the long run.

13.hg Nc6 14.Ne5

And the Black position is critical as White threatens 15.Bh7+ Nh7 16.Qh5.

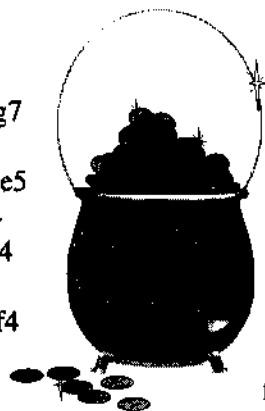

BASICS FOR THE LEARNING PLAYER

By National Master Tom Cooper

When I started teaching chess in the ICA\Warren Jr. Chess Program I was amazed at the number of students that were well versed in opening traps in double K-pawn openings. Everyone knew how to beat the "Fried Liver", 1.e4 e5 2.Nf3 Nc6 3.Bc4 Nf6 4.Ng5 d5 5.ed Nd5? 6.Nf7!, and how to avoid it with 5...Na5. Yet, when I set up different variations such as 1.e4 e5 2.Nf3 Nc6 3.Bc4 Nf6 4.Nc3, no one could tell me what was wrong with White's last move. I would then continue with 4...Ne4 5.Ne4 d5 and explain how White was losing his development when several students would point out that White has 5.Bf7+ instead of 5.Ne4. They felt that White had to be better as Black's King was in the open and couldn't castle. My earlier amazement waned as I realized that well versed was actually well rehearsed; they had memorized opening moves and didn't understand the ideas behind them.

One evening, after a session, I began searching for illustrative games that would supplement the lessons. I found that most opening manuals for beginners gave few game citations, let alone extended analysis that could reveal the proper plan the learning player should follow. No wonder the kids memorized the moves; they had few guides to explain the ideas behind them.

This article is the result of my search through game collections, old tournament books and magazines to find key games that illustrate not just the continuation of opening analysis, but also reveal the themes and ideas that underly the moves.

Game One: Where losing the right to castle

means little when we obtain rapid development and control of the center.

Kuerschner-Tarrasch,Nuremberg,1889.

1.e4 e5 2.Bc4 Nf6 3.Nc3

The move 3.d3 is certainly playable and leads to the Bishop's Opening. By playing 3.Nc3 White transposes to the Vienna Game (Opening) 1.e4 e5 2.Nc3 Nf6 3.Bc4. A major point of confusion for beginning players occurs when they look for the game move order in their opening books. It's not listed under Bishop's Opening, but under the Vienna.

3...Ne4

By using the idea of a fork trick Black temporarily captures a pawn and strives to diminish White's central control.

4.Bf7+?

Although Black now loses the possibility of castling, it doesn't cause any problems for his King. He will achieve more than enough compensation with a powerful center and accelerated development. If White had tried 4.Ne4 d5 5.Bd3 de 6.Be4 f5! Black would control more of the center and have the better game.

4...Kf7 5.Ne4 d5

Seizing more central control with gain of time.

6.Qf3+

White continues to attack in the misguided belief that the Black King is exposed. Unless White can crash through into the Black Kings's position the

misplaced Queen will be a future target for attack.

6...Kg8 7.Ne2

Not anxious to retreat with the N, White sets an obvious trap. If 7.Ng5 Qd7 8.Ne2 h6 9.Nh3 Bc5 and Black has the upper hand.

7...Be6!

Black's only weakness is on the White squares. Not 7...de?? 8.Qb3+ and mate follows. Now, after 7...Be6!, the N must move.

8.Ng3 Nc6

More development, more pressure on the center, more threats.

9.a3

White already has problems. The Ng3 has little scope and Black has a logical plan of development with ...Qd7,...Bc5,...Rf8, and...h5. If White tries to strike at the center with 9.c3 and 10.d4, Black has 9...Bc5.

9...Qd7

Now White must be alert for ...Bg4.

10.h3 Bc5

threatens ...Rf8 and ...Bf7+. Black has an overwhelming position as White can't recover from the loss of his opening development (remember 4.Bf7+?) and misplaced pieces.

11.00 h5!

Further restricting White's game as the h-pawn can't be captured due to ...Rf8.

12.Nh1

Crying before he's hurt in anticipation of ...h4.

12...Rf8 13.Qg3 h4 14.Qh2

All the White K-side pieces are stepping on each others toes.

14...e4

threatening ...Bd6

15.d3

White's first step towards the center since move 7!

15...Bd6 16.Bf4

If 16.Nf4 g5 or 16.f4 ef e.p.

16...Rf4! 17.Nf4 g5 0-1.

White never overcame Black's lead in development and central control. Next issue: Kuerschmer's "improvement" against the same opponent ☐

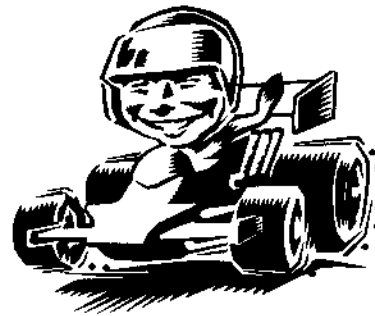
NILES NORTH SWEEPS 4TH ANNUAL FOX VALLEY HIGH SCHOOL TEAM CHAMPIONSHIP

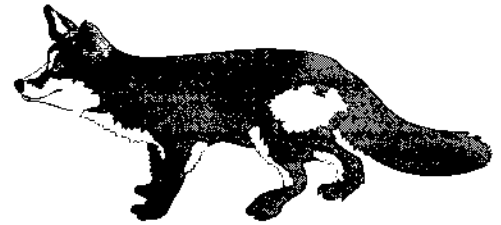

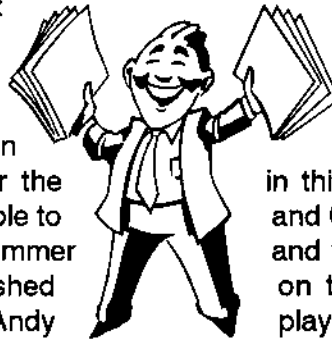

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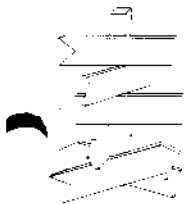
